

Daniel DiMarino is a composer, arranger, music producer, and violinist from Chester County, Pennsylvania. He has written music in many different styles, including many classical works, arrangements, cinematic tracks, electronic music, and a few scores for short films. Daniel recently completed his bachelor's degree at the Cleveland Institute of Music, studying music composition with Dr. Keith Fitch and violin performance with Dr. Olga Dubossarskaya Kaler.

Daniel recently composed *Endlight*, a cinematic orchestral piece he wrote for the Canton Youth Symphony as this year's Composer Fellow to be conducted by Matthew Jaroszewicz. Daniel's recent awards also include 1st place in the Webster University Young Composer Competition for the 2020-2021 season with *Three Sketches*, and 2nd place in the Ohio Federation of Music Clubs contest in 2022 with his mixed-ensemble work, *Escapade*.

Daniel's most recent classical works include a miniature opera based on the book of Ruth; an orchestral piece, *Mystic*, which was recently read at the fall composition reading at CIM; and *Caprice* for solo viola. He was selected as the 2018 winner of the youth category for the Marvin Hamlisch Film Score Contest and has since gained experience in screen scoring, music production, and electronic music.
